#### FOR THE RESCUER

### ROOFER RESCUE:

On March 2, we were invited by the Clarkston (WA) Fire Department to provide their full-time and volunteer firefighters



with our briefing on preparing for rescuing a worker suspended in a fall arrest harness at a construction site. We also discussed some of the things to think about when responding to emergencies involving people with special needs. Thank you, Clarkston Fire, for this opportunity!

**ROPE TRAINING**: We are currently working with a couple of agencies on organizing a one-day class to train first responders who lack rope rescue skills in how they can support a rope rescue. Our goal is to develop a program and then offer the training throughout the western US. Contact us for more information.

**RESCUE TIP:** When visiting schools, be sure to spend time with the education special classes. Remember. many of these kids are afraid of people uniform. You need to show these kids that people in uniform are there to help, so you



don't need to be afraid of them.

**TRIVIA ANSWER:** The U-2 DragonLady provides day and night, high-altitude (70,000 feet, 21,300 meters), all-weather intelligence gathering. Lockheed Corporation originally proposed it in 1953, it was approved in 1954, and its first test flight was in 1955. It was flown during the Cold War over the Soviet Union, China, Vietnam, and Cuba. The U-2 continues to fly today with the U.S. Air Force.
