AUTISM IN THE WILD: For the past two years, we have hosted a team from The Isaac Foundation of Spokane, Washington so that they could provide this exceptional training to area first responders. The training provides information on how to respond to incidents involving people with autism.

In the past, this training was held in McCall. On February 26, 2022, we will be coordinating the training in Asotin, Washington. The training will be hosted by the Lewiston Police Department.

11/07/21 - Gripstone Climbing, Prescott, Arizona: Sunday, November found 7 Courageous Kids Climbing in Prescott, Arizona. 17 courageous climbers came out to spend some time climbing the walls at Gripstone Climbing and Café. This event is one of the community outreach events that the Prescott Fire Department is involved in. They were supported by members of the Prescott Police Department and Lifeline Ambulance. The kids took advantage of meeting all of the first responders and getting personal tours of their emergency vehicles. Some of the kids even went home with balloons made from the protective gloves that the first responders use. Several of the kids also received medals from the firefighters and police officers. A physical therapist was also on-site to help offer suggestions on how to help the kids climb.

The kids in the Lewis-Clark Valley have spent the day with the Nez Perce tribe and checked out police cars and officers. Rock Supremacy

He has also been a substitute school teacher. He also worked part-time as a private safety coordinator for nearly three-dozen companies for 39-years. He lives in McCall, Idaho with his wife Charlotte.
